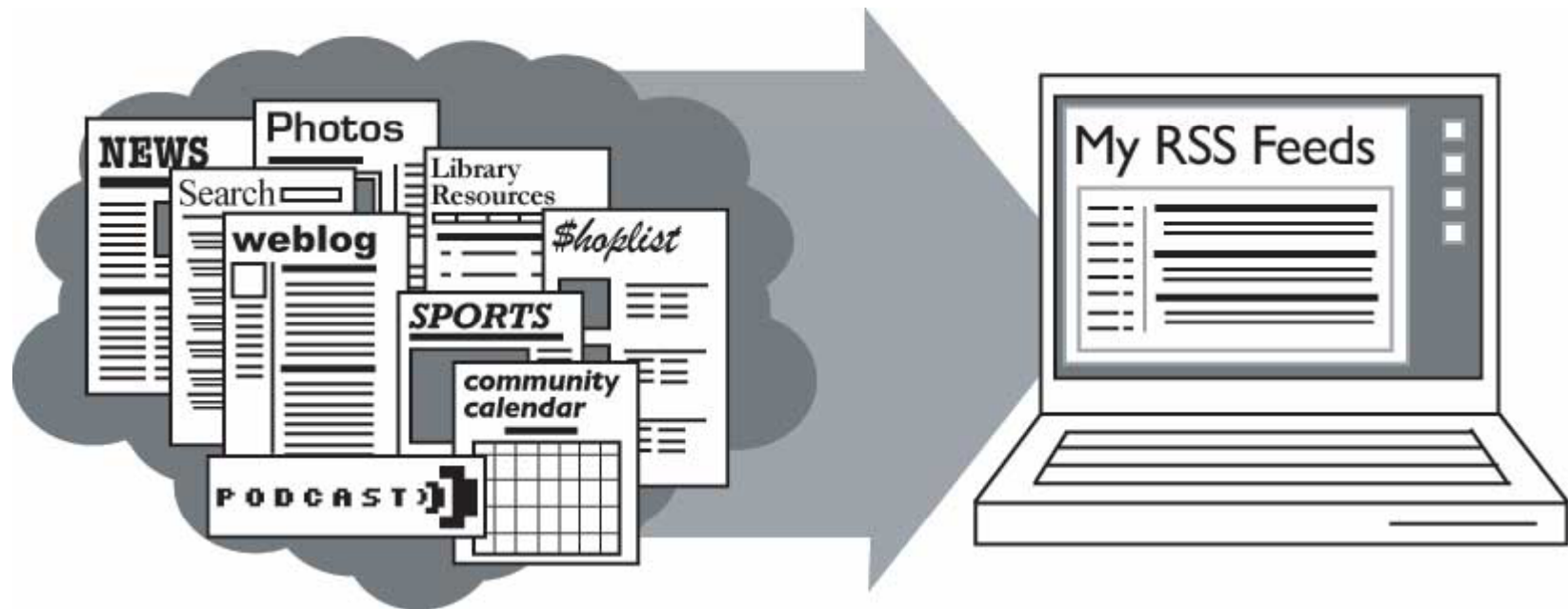


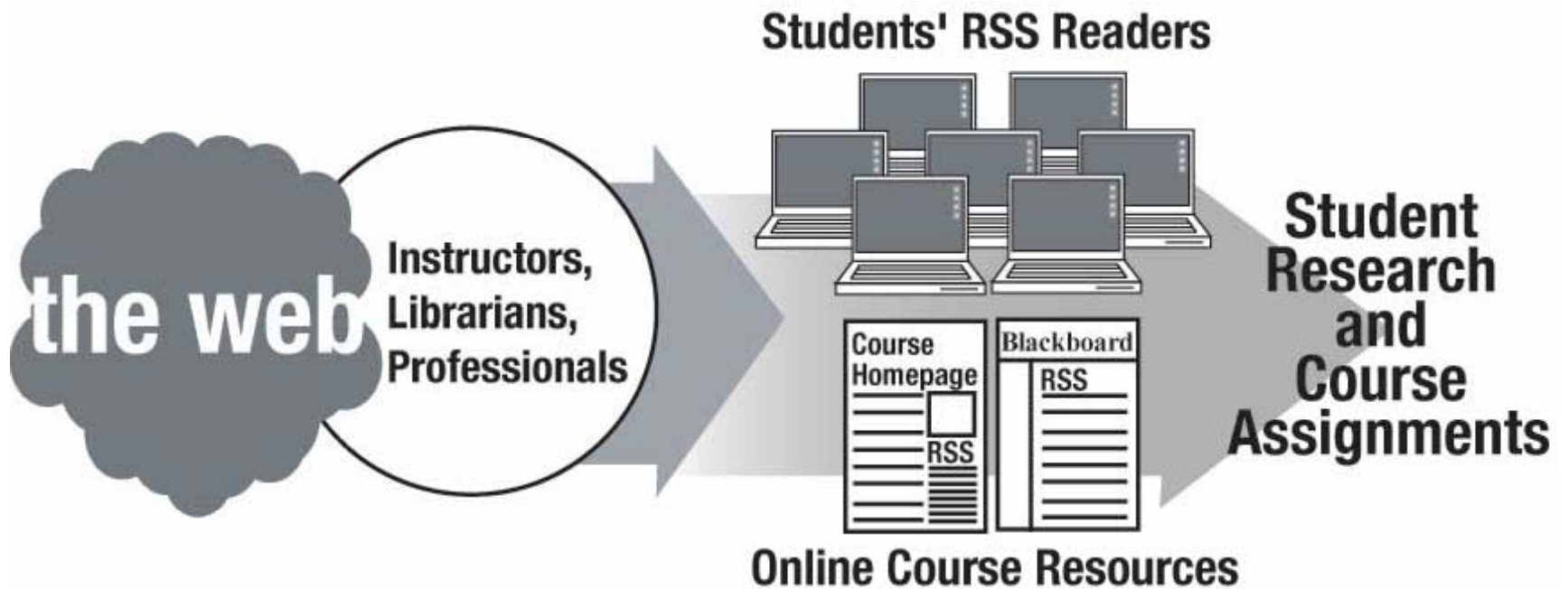

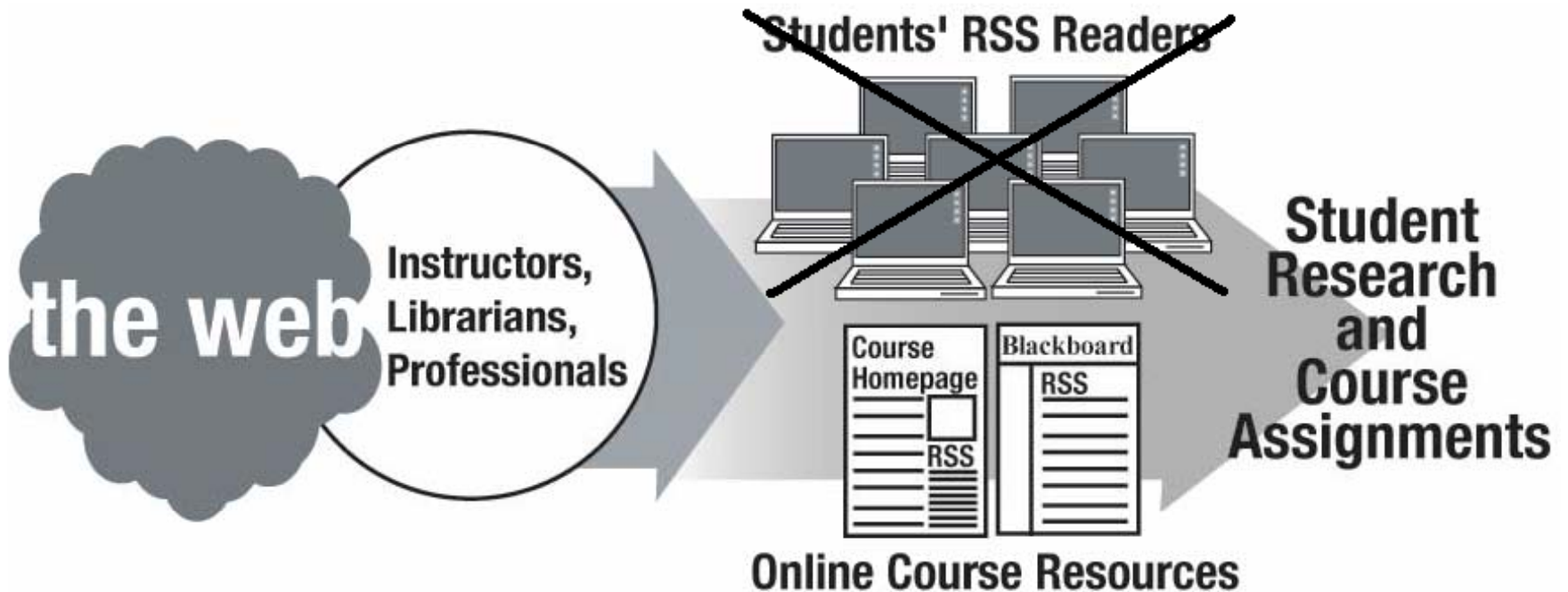
The Good

- ❑ Free
- ❑ Automatic
- ❑ Build Current Awareness
- ❑ Idea Generator
- ❑ Personally Meaningful
- ❑ Goodbye Email Alerts
- ❑ In Academic Databases
 - ❑ Consistent Searching

The Bad

- ❑ User Training
- ❑ Requires Maintaining Another Account
- ❑ Demanding of Attention
- ❑ Can Be a Distraction
- ❑ Full-text Embargo
- ❑ More load for Information Overload

- Drawback: Only displays 10 items

 - Much more difficult than RapidFeeds


Port Feeds to Other Services

Uses



- Subject guides: pushes current awareness, breadth
- Department liaison: publicly post info for faculty
- Virtual book displays: e.g.: delicious feeds
- Manage content from multiple sources on your website
- Intranet: more permanence than email, less detailed than wikis
- Combined with blogging, could be an alternative to course message boards, while archiving student writing
