

Macalester Named a Most Promising Place to Work in Student Affairs at Baccalaureate and Liberal Arts Institutions for 2015

St. Paul, Minn. – Macalester College has been named one of the 2015 Promising Places to Work in Student Affairs at Baccalaureate and Liberal Arts Institutions by the American College Personnel Association (ACPA) and *Diverse: Issues in Higher Education*. This designation is an honor recognizing Student Affairs at Macalester for its commitment to workplace diversity, equitable staffing practices, and supportive work environments.

The Most Promising Places to Work in Student Affairs national survey was first commissioned by the ACPA and *Diverse: Issues In Higher Education* in 2011. Promising Places to Work in Student Affairs is part of a collaborative initiative between ACPA and *Diverse*, which consists of a national study conducted by the Center for Higher Education Enterprise (CHEE) at The Ohio State University.

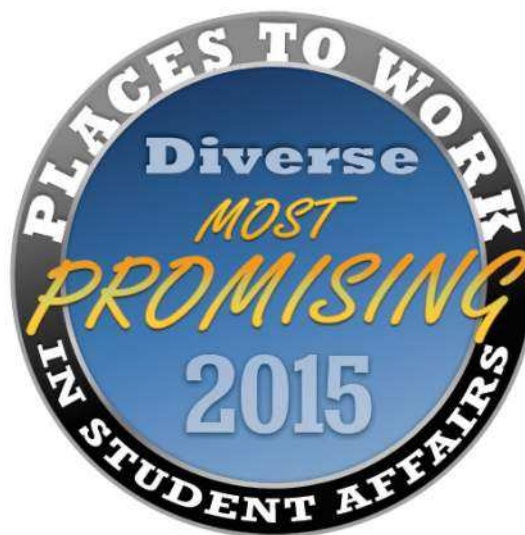
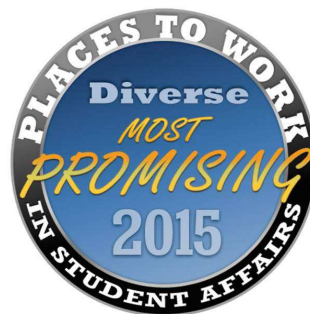
The national study employs a web-based survey approach to elicit information from ACPA member institutions. A multipart, weighted algorithm was used to classify the responding institutions in the final phase of analysis.

The purpose of this commissioned study was to examine the extent to which diversity and inclusion permeates aspects (e.g., administrative structures, commitments, work environments, staffing practices) of various divisions of student affairs (or equivalent) at participating ACPA member institutions across the globe.
