III. STUDY PROGRAMS

***Intensive Study of Nepali Language at University of Wisconsin, Madison, Summer 1982**

Nepali, the national language of Nepal and of millions of other people in Darjeeling, Sikkim, Assam, Bhutan and Garwhal, will be taught intensively at the University of Wisconsin, Madison, this summer from June 7 to August 13. The course description is as follows:

Elementary Nepali Intensive: This course concentrates on grammar, script, and simple texts in written Nepali keyed to the cultural heritage. Conversation is pointed toward preparation for use in actual social situations as well as toward learning the grammar. The class meets 4 hours daily, 5 days a week: 8:55-10:45 a.m. and 11:45 a.m. to 1:45 p.m. Undergraduate and special students register for 10 credits and graduate students register for 8 credits.

The 10-week South Asian Summer Language Program begins on June 7th and runs through August 13th. Registration will be June 7th concurrent with the first day of class. The program actually consists of two 5-week consecutive sessions which provide the student with one year's training in the language taken, therefore, the student must register for both 5-week sessions on June 7th.

Summer registration fees are based on a per-credit rate and are subject to change before the Summer Session begins.
